Most black and Asian people living in Britain are those who came here in the 1950's and early 1960's , or their children and grandchildren . At the time there simply weren't enough British workers to perform their jobs . Thousands of West Indians were recruited to drive London's buses and tube trains and to work as hospital porters and nurses . Indians and Pakistanis came to work in clothing factories in cities .

" Britain has never had American-style ethnic ghettos . " says Ceri Peach , a professor of social geography who has carried out research for the Government's Office for National Statistics .

" Indians are highly suburbanised , and the last census revealed that black Caribbeans , are increasingly likely to move from the inner cities to the suburbs . "

Policeman Garry Liburd is an example of this trend . His parents , both from the Leeward Islands in the West Indies , came to Britain in the late 1950's and settled in Northampton , where Garry was born . He now lives in the predominantly white London suburb of Moden .

Garry Liburd is at ease with his cultural identity . He is proud to be the son of West Indian immigrants , and he hopes to pass on that side of his culture to his son when he's older .
