Petroleum is a source of energy which is growing more and more in the 21st century industry as it often replaces electricity and steam power . The oil industry is a major one .

The present largest oil fields are to be found in the U.S.A and Russia which use their whole output for their own industrial needs .

European countries produce very little petroleum , but some countries – Norway and Scotland – are now successfully spending much money on exploration and drilling in order to discover this fabulous precious black liquid with their off-shore platforms .

Deep oil-wells are sunk into many places and sometimes petroleum gushes out or can be pumped . That is the case in the Algerian Sahara where the pipelines are already crawling across the country to the sea-coast , then across the sea to Europe through Spain and Italy .

Each year , in the Arzew , Skikda and El Harrach refineries , millions of tons of crude oil from the Sahara are processed and supply light oil such as kerosene and gasoline for planes and cars , and heavy oils such as fuel oils , Diesel oils and lubricating oils for machinery .
